BOAT RAMP

Always a source for good discussion we once again bring up the subject of the Boat Ramp, which is maintained by the SDRA. Last summer a great deal of work was put into replacing all of the facing boards on the cement dock. All of the men on the executive worked the entire day and a fine job they did. Special thanks to Gord Kissman who also helped and Barry Smith who provided hydro and needed tools. Your executive attended several council meetings and have received approval to commence charging a fee for boat launching. This is the only way we can raise funds for repairs and maintenance. The marina has kindly offered to accept this fee during operating hours and the current steel drop box will be used when the marina is closed.

PAID SDRA MEMBERS WILL NOT BE REQUIRED TO PAY The fee is intended to cover the costs of non-members or businesses using the facility. The waiving of the fee however is only intended for Paid Residential SDRA Members Only. We cannot however extend this fee waiver to SDRA members operating a business that would require boat launch usage.

This process is an honor system and we certainly hope we can count on everyone's co-operation and patience as the fee is implemented.

The fee will be \$5.00 for both in/out, which we feel, is very reasonable.

A request has been also made to the Township for a donation of \$5,600.00 to help defray the some of the costs required for improvements, repairs and paving.

We would like to point out that the cement dock is NOT FOR OVERNIGHT DOCKING This area can get very rough and we cannot be responsible for any damage caused to boats left there.

BEACH CONDITIONS

The two main beaches on Skootamatta have improved immensely and we hope it continues. However, there has still been glass found on several occasions at Big Island. Please remember to take a garbage bag with you when you go to the beach. If we all clean up our own garbage there should not be any left for the next visitor. We remind everyone to not leave fires unattended. If you find an unattended fire, please put it out

SEPTIC CHECK

As our lake gets older so do our septic systems. An unchecked septic can cause serious damage to our lake. Sometimes the damage can take years to correct. Please, for the sake of Skootamatta Lake have your system checked and help keep our lake clean for generations to come.

BOATING SPEED NOTICES

Legislation has been passed to restrict the speed of recreational boats to 10 kilometers per hour within 30 metres of shore (This means you too Willy!) This is now the law in Ontario.

The executive thanks both of them very much and any other cottagers who have marked rocks in the lake. If you are aware of any rocks posing a threat near your shoreline, please mark them or contact your executive and we would be pleased to place a marker. Bill Garnish and Ron Nowell plan to have the remaining rocks marked no later than the end of May.

FOCA/COFA

During our AGM last summer, Dave Dacuk graciously accepted the role of being our FOCA/COFA representative. FOCA is our representative when dealing with many issues including Native Land Claims. We have not been advised of any further developments with respect to the Native Land Claim /Lands for Life in our area other than the recent newsletter sent out to all residents in March 1998. We will have copies of this letter for distribution at our AGM. Please feel free to ask Dave about any concerns you may have with FOCA/COFA issues.

MNR REMOVAL OF EGGS

Ron Nowell, Vice-President attended the April 20,1998 Council meeting to voice the SDRA's concern that eggs were being removed from Skootamatta Lake several days prior without our approval. The MNR did not advise the SDRA nor did they advise COFA. Needless to say we were very upset about this. The situation was reported in the local paper and a letter was sent to the MNR from the Council supporting our request that any future removals must be done with proper approvals. The MNR verbally promised to replace the eggs with "pickeral fry" of approximately 250,000. Our FOCA/COFA Rep, Dave Dacuk has confirmed the "fry" were placed in Skootamatta the first week of May.

FOCA LAKE STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

This program is relatively new to us and is completely dependent on volunteers such as you to get it running. Doug Clark enthusiastically volunteered to be Skootamatta Lakes representative. However, FOCA only just announced the release of a how-to manual for Lake Stewardship. The manual has been ordered and we hope it is received in time for the

AGM. Stewardship issues involve water quality, wildlife, and bird conservation among many things. This is not a one-person responsibility IT IS EVERYONES RESPONSIBILTY. So please give Doug Clark a hand with the job.

CANADIAN COAST GUARD

We are attaching a warning from FOCA with regards to the CCG'S recommendations for boating regulations, vessel licensing and enforcement. Please let your opinions be heard by contacting the names provided.

COMMMUNITY POLICING

Ron Nowell, Vice-President has given valuable time over the winter dealing with the issue of Community Policing. This facility is completely driven by the number of members wishing to volunteer time to it. Please bring your questions to the AGM. In order for this to succeed we will need a liaison and several volunteers.

Given the increase in break-ins we really need to put this in place. This is a large undertaking and will need a committee separate from the lake association for it to have any impact.

COTTAGE WATCH

"Cottage Watch" is a partnership for cottage safety between the OPP, FOCA and your Cottage Association. Anyone interested in starting this program please feel free to contact your executive. Please remember this is strictly a volunteer program and not a business venture. This program differs from Community Policing as it is run only by volunteers very much the same way as Neighbourhood Watch/Block Parents programs currently underway in the cities. The OPP will recognize efforts made and COFA will provide the starter kits.

GREAT ONTARIO DIP-IN

During Canada Week, June 28 to July 5, 1998, Ontario's cottager's will be dipping into water as part of an ongoing campaign to measure the health of the provinces 250,00 lakes. By joining the dip-in you can help your cottage association contribute to the documentation of the province's water quality. Dipping-In refers to Secchi disc dipping which is a do-it-yourself method of testing the lakes clarity. We have attached a sample Secchi disc for your use.

HOW TO BUILD A SECCHI DISC

Cut out the disc from the sample provided and attach it to a clean paint can lid or other similar base. You will also need a weight.

A hockey puck works very well as a weight.

Drill a hole in the centre of the disc and the weight.

Mark a ¼" thick rope in metres using a waterproof marker. The rope should be at least 10 metres in length.

Thread the rope through the disc and weight and secure using washers and a nut. Tie the rope to an eyebolt or handle.

HOW TO TAKE A READING Take the reading away from shore in the deepest part of the lake, over the shady side of the boat. Do not wear sunglasses.

Lower the Secchi disc into the water. Record the depth it disappears. (Reading A) Slowly raise the Secchi disc a few centimetres recording the depth at which it reappears (Reading B) Average the two readings using the formula (A+B) divided by 2. Drop off your reading along with your name and reading location at Skootamatta Marina before JULY 20/98. The SDRA will submit the readings to FOCA and post the results at the marina in early August. PLEASE HELP US by participating.

The Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) has proposed sweeping changes to boating regulations in the areas of vessel licencing, operator proficiency, and enforcement. FOCA has monitored the process closely, and believes that the CCG has recommended to the federal government that the new Canada wide computerized vessel identification system include ALL vessels (ie 40' cabin cruisers, 30' sailboats, 21' runabouts, 13' aluminum fishing boats with 5 horsepower motors, 12' canoes, rowboats, windsurfers, pedal boats, virtually anything that floats!). There will likely be a renewable fee involved every two years for power vessels, and every five years for other boats.

FOCA has been advised that the CCG has also recommended a mandatory operator proficiency system, initially for all operators of recreational boats, 16 years of age and under. For those over 16 years of age, it would be phased in over a period of ten years, based on age. Initially those 16 and under would be required to carry with them proof of having acquired a basic knowledge of boating, and after ten years this would apply to ALL boaters.

If you don't agree with the above, then you should communicate your thoughts to the Commissioner of the CCG, David B. Watters, as shown below TODAY, as legislation and regulations will be finalized in the very near future. Alternatively, you can contact your local MP and tell him/her your views.




